

## **ABSTRACT**

Name of Applicant: Central Washington University (CWU) City/State: Ellensburg, Washington Project Objectives/Activities: CWU a four-year public university, is proposing to continue offering HEP services to address the needs of its Migrant and Seasonal Farmworker (MSFW) students. CWU HEP's goal is to recruit and enroll 80 eligible commuter students and provide them with the intensive academic, career, financial, and support services they need to successfully reach their education and career goals. CWU HEP's annual objectives and outcomes are: Objective 1: Conduct intakes on 80 eligible participants and enroll them into the HEP Program; Objective 2: To provide 80 HEP students with HSE preparation and instruction to graduate 69% of the cohort with their HSED (GPRA 1); and Objective 3: To place 80% HEP HSED graduates into post-secondary education, training program, first-time or upgraded employment, career or the military annually (GPRA 2). Applicable Priorities: CWU addresses: Competitive Preference Priority 1 - Fostering Flexible and Affordable Paths to Obtaining Knowledge and Skills and Competitive Preference Priority 2 - Consideration of Prior Experience as a successful 20-year HEP grant recipient. Participants/Sites: CWU HEP will serve 80 eligible commuter students from its established location in Yakima, WA. Of the 80 MSFW students served annually, 69% will successfully obtain their HSED certificate (GPRA 1) and 80% of these graduates will transition into postsecondary education, training program, military, or will obtain a first-time or upgraded employment (GPRA 2).
