Abstract

Name of Applicant:Heritage UniversityCitv/State:Toppenish, WashingtonProject Objectives & Activities:The annual HEP Project objectives are: A) To providerecruitment in a culturally appropriate manner to over 600 un-served and under-served migrantand seasonal farmworkers into the HEP Program; B) To conduct intakes on 100 individuals todetermine initial eligibility and enroll into the HEP Program; C) Develop 100 IndividualEducational Plans (IEPs) with HEP students; D) To administer HEP Educational Assessmentsand Vocational Evaluations to 100 students; E) To provide 100 HEP students with HSEpreparation instruction to graduate 69 with a HSED credential annually (GPRA 1); and F) Toprovide 100 participants with Academic and Career Counseling to place 55 HEP HSEDgraduates into postsecondary education, career, up-graded employment or the military annually(GPRA 2).

Priorities: Heritage will address **Competitive Preference Priority 1.**

<u>Outcomes:</u> Outreach will be conducted to 600 MSFWs; 100 HEP eligibility and enrollment documents will be on file; 100 Individual Education Plans will be on file; All HEP students receive an objective/ educational assessment; 100 test results will be on file; 100 will be assessed for support services needs and service plans will be developed; 100 HEP students gain computer competencies; 100 Academic & Career Pre-and Post-competencies assessments on file; and 25 students engaged in work readiness training and offered placement services.

<u>Participants:</u> Will serve 100 participants with a commuter program equally served in 3 sites.
Proposed Sites: Three sites will be served - Toppenish, Granger & Mattawa in Washington.
<u>GPRA Targets</u>: GPRA 1 = 69 or (69%) participants will attain a HSED and 55 or (80%) will be placed into postsecondary education, career, up-graded employment or the military annually.
